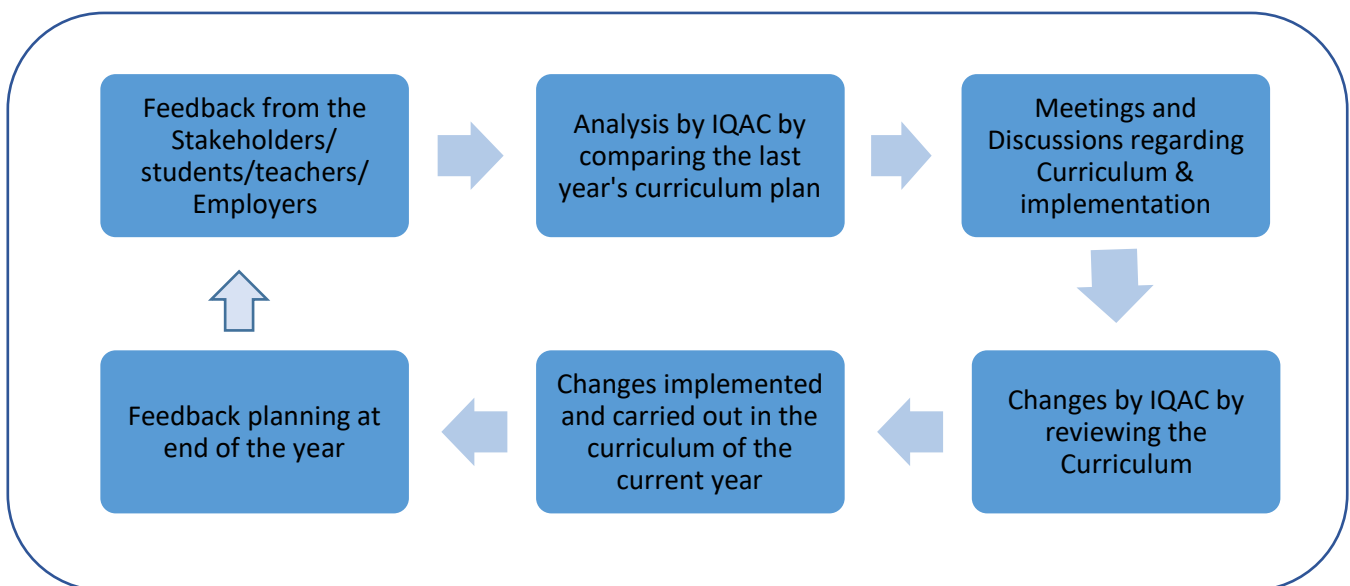

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b. Communication of decisions to all concerned

Once decisions regarding curriculum revisions or new implementations are made, the following communication channels are utilized to ensure smooth dissemination of information:

1. Faculty Meetings and Staff Council

Decisions made during the planning and review process are communicated to all faculty members through staff council meetings. The academic calendar and specific changes to the curriculum are discussed in these meetings to ensure that every department is aligned with the new directions.

2. Student Communication

Changes in the curriculum or academic calendar are communicated to students via notice boards, official college circulars, and digital platforms like the Learning Management System (LMS). Orientation sessions are conducted at the beginning of each semester to inform students about the curriculum and any updates that have been made.

3. Mentor and Supervisor Communication

Mentors and supervisors play a key role in guiding students through the curriculum. They are briefed on all changes to ensure they provide the necessary support and feedback to students in alignment with the updated curriculum.

4. External Stakeholder Engagement
