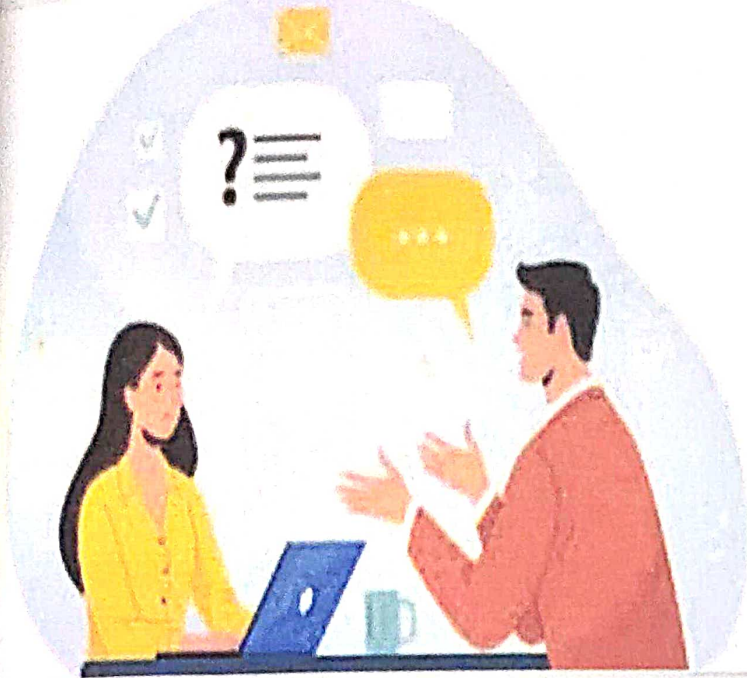

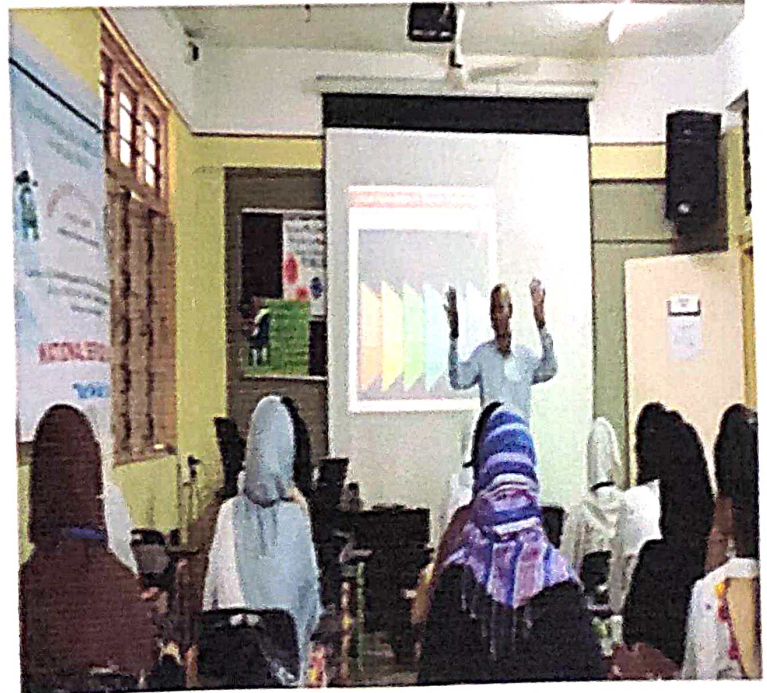

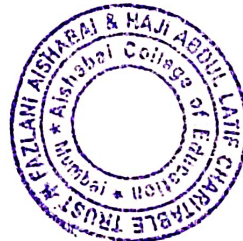

It is not enough for the kids to learn the lessons from the textbooks, but they should be given adequate space and time for letting the innertalents get a platform to be showcased.



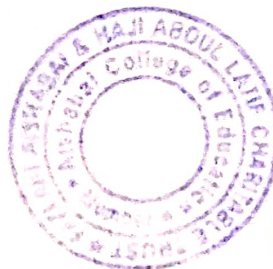
Importance of exhibition

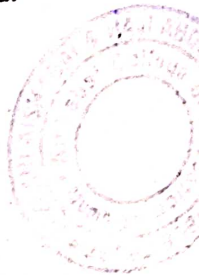

You can also find out about the application, interview and recruitment process. You should prepare to answer questions about yourself as well.

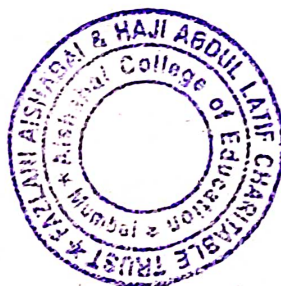
Here are some of the key reasons why graduates should attend careers fairs:

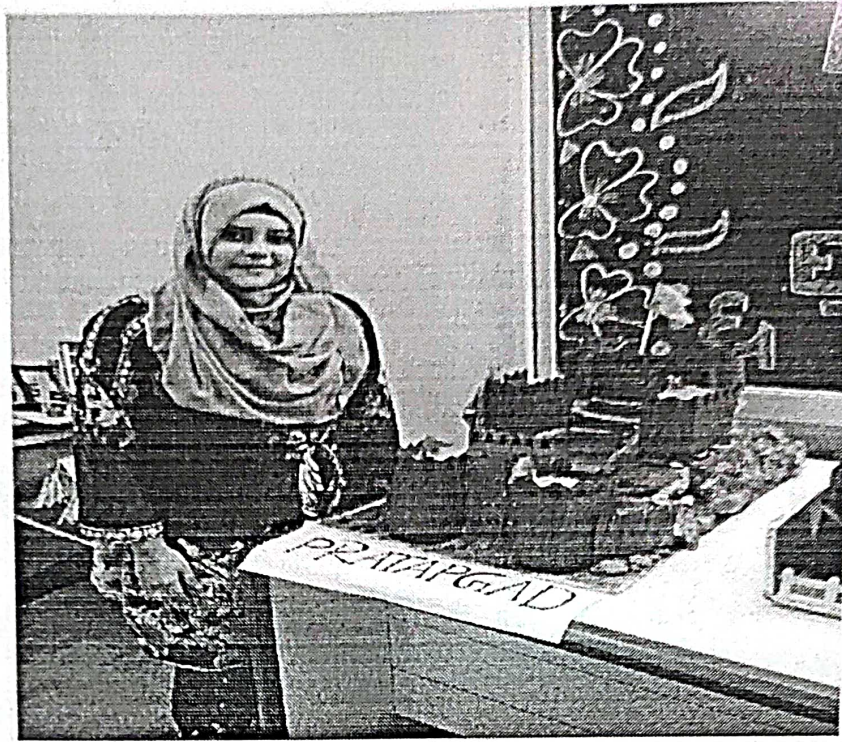
After attending the exhibitions I have realized that exhibitions are diverse both in content and execution. Attending exhibitions are helpful because it benefit us professionally and personally.

We gain more knowledge from exhibitions and we learn by enjoying.

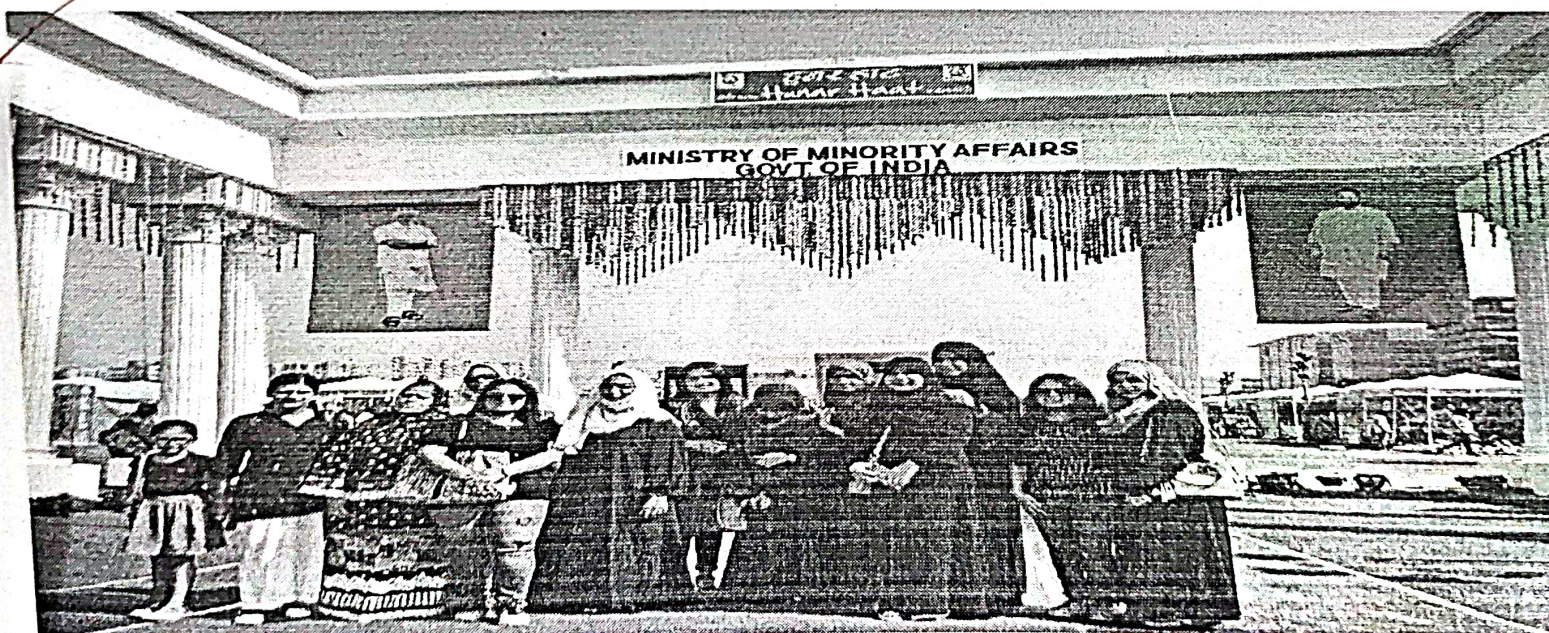

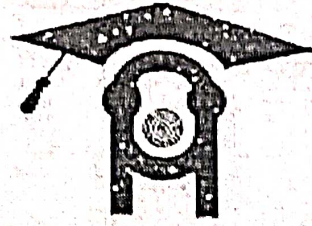

Q.17. Where do you see your professional development 5 years from now?

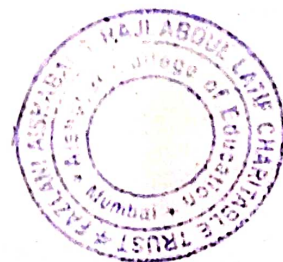
