
Platform: Online platforms, specifically social media, were utilized to disseminate information about cleanliness and its importance.

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Swachhata cleaning activities on the school and college premises


Date: 27th September 2023

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extremely successful, achieving its goal of creating a clean and healthy learning environment. It also increased the responsibility and ecological awareness of the volunteer.



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




Swachhata: A Solemn Promise






## Swachhata Cleaning of public places and Society

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

#### Shramdaan- Yusuf Meherally Centre

#### Date: 23th December 2023

#### Venue: Yusuf Meherally Centre

Our recent visit to the Yusuf Meherally Center in Panvel, an organization promoting rural development for people in neighboring villages, was an exciting discovery of India's rich historical landscape. The Yusuf Meherally Center is a voluntary organization registered under the Societies Registration Act (1860) and the Bombay Public Trust Act (1950). - Founded in memory of the famous freedom fighter Yusuf Meherally. The center is a repository of information that preserves and preserves the main features of our nation's past. There are beautiful ceramics, crafts, handmade soaps and more to buy. It serves as a hub for various community activities, educational programs and events that contribute to the growth and development of the area. The center aims to provide a platform for cultural exchange and community participation, making it an important gathering place for locals and visitors alike.

self-care and healthy eating. After that he took the students to Shramdaan at 10.30 am. Students were asked to form a group of 4 for Shramdaan. Each group was assigned different tasks or tasks such as organizing saplings, collecting plastic waste, sweeping fields and cleaning tables and gardens. Students undertook several activities to connect with the grassroots and observe, understand and reflect on rural and tribal realities up close. All the teacherstudents did well and gave their best. It took 3/4 hours to complete Shramdaan. After Shramdaan students rest for 1 hour and play musical games and songs. After that, the Yellow House sketch was about Human Rights Day. The series showed us some of our basic rights which are right to education, right to equality and right to vote. This center employed the tribal population of the village in various small-scale units producing edible oil, pottery, non-edible oil, soap, bakery, compost etc. In addition, there is a school where 400 tribal children study for free, and a guest house. Where 100 girls spend the night - financed by donations received from the organization. It also has its own wellness center. Then the student teachers and all the teachers had lunch in the canteen. The students were then divided into 2 groups. They then began a tour of the center where the students saw small pottery, oil and biogas. Some of the small industries were closed. Finally everyone settled outside the 'bapu kut' where Mr. Devidas Patil shared his views. He gave information about history like Simon go back, Quit India movement etc. Mr. Devidas Patil spoke to us and informed us about the Yusuf Meherally Center. He told us that the name of the organizer of the center is Mr. Harishchandra Waghe. Yusuf Meherally was a freedom fighter who worked for Indian independence with Mahatma Gandhi and paved the way for the Quit India Movement during independence. Apart from his historical



All students-teachers and teachers gathered at Panvel station in the morning and took a taxi to Yusuf Meherally center which took about 30 minutes. The group gathered for breakfast in the center's dining hall at 9:30 am. The meeting was then chaired by Mr. Devidas Patil. He gave information about Yusuf Meherally and explained the importance of

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knowledge, he gave us life lessons which included that one should always be kind to others, then everyone had tea, after which he took a taxi and reached Panvel station at 5.30pm.



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Teaching learning process for Inclusive children


Date: 15th Jan to 21st Jan 2024


#### DAY 2 - 16th January 24 Resource Person: Mr. Ashok Sir Skill Development- Lecture cum activities Activities for special children



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




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#### DAY 7 - 21st January 24 Chief guest: Dr. Asia Radiowala ma' am Valedictory function for NSS Special Camp






Conduct a quiz at the school level about awareness of the electoral process


#### Learning outcomes:

#### Date: 17th February 2024



- Students develop a sense of responsibility and ownership in participating in a democratic system by voting and participating in political activities.


- Students can implement strategies to promote voter participation and civic engagement among peers and the broader community.



- 2. Conversation: student teachers did a summary on human rights to emphasize the importance of individual rights.
- 3. Visiting different places:--- Pottery: A small unit where pottery was made, try making pots if you are interested.--Gaushala:-We visited a Gaushala where different types of cows were kept.--Oil production:-We showed the production of cold pressed oil. They explained the oil production method to us.- Butterfly Garden - The center also has a butterfly garden, a flower garden, a garden of fruits, vegetables and many medicinal plants.--Bapu Kuti:- We saw a replica of "Bapu kuti" at Sewagram where Gandhiji lived. It is an inch-by-inch replica to promote an eco-friendly lifestyle. It is made of clay bricks and covered with a layer of cow dung.

All students-teachers and teachers gathered at Panvel station in the morning and took a taxi to Yusuf Meherally center which took about 30 minutes. The group gathered for breakfast in the center's dining hall at 9:30 am. The meeting was then chaired by Mr. Devidas Patil. He gave information about Yusuf Meherally and explained the importance of self-care and healthy eating. After that he took the students to Shramdaan at 10.30 am. Students were asked to form

a group of 4 for Shramdaan. Each group was assigned different tasks or tasks such as an tasks or tasks such as organizing saplings, collecting plastic waste, sweeping fields and sweeping fields and cleaning tables and gardens. Students undertook several activity undertook several activities to connect with the grassroots up observe, understand and reflect on rural and tribal realities up close. All the teacher-students did well and gave their best. It took 3/4 hours to complete Shramdaan, After Shramdaan students rest for 1 hour and play musical games and songs. After that, the Yellow House sketch was about 1 House sketch was about Human Rights Day. The series showed us some of our basic victors some of our basic rights which are right to education, right to equality and right to vote. This center employed the tribal population of the village in various small-scale units producing edible oil potters edible oil, pottery, non-edible oil, soap, bakery, compost etc. In addition there: addition, there is a school where 400 tribal children study for free, and a guest house. It also has its own wellness center. Then the student teachers and all the teachers had lunch in the canteen. The students were then divided into 2 groups. They then began a tour of the center where the students saw small pottery, oil and biogas. Some of the small industries were closed.

Finally everyone settled outside the 'bapu kuti' where Mr. Devidas Patil shared his views. He gave information about history like Simon go back, Quit India movement etc. Mr. Devidas Patil spoke to us and informed us about the Yusuf Meherally Center. He told us that the name of the organizer of the center is Mr. Harishchandra Waghe. Yusuf Meherally was a freedom fighter who worked for Indian independence with Mahatma Gandhi and paved the way for the Quit India Movement during independence

These tips were created and distributed through posters, brochures and social media messages so that the community can easily access key information to prevent the spread of infection. The COVID virus. 19.


5. Prepare and share a PowerPoint presentation on social networks
